**TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

In his well-known saying, “Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God,” Jesus makes the strong point that we should give “God’s things” as much attention and importance as “Caesar’s things.” Caesar’s world and God’s world are not distinct or separate, but are really one and the same. As humans we dwell in both, not in one and not the other. We must be active participants in both civil society and the Church. “Caesar” should safeguard the rights and responsibilities of “God” and help the Church to flourish. At the same time the Church should, by teaching and upholding values found in the natural law, strengthen and enrich civil society.

Both God and Caesar have a claim on us. In making our ethical decisions, and then voting them, we must defer to “God” by following the principles Jesus gave us. At the same time we must be responsive to “Caesar” by supporting, and even campaigning, for those candidates who can most forcefully and to best advantage effect those principles.
