THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus’ answer to the Pharisees’ question, “Which commandment in the law is the greatest?” is what they want to hear, that the greatest and the first commandment is “You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.”

But then Jesus continues when they expect him to stop, “The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.” And then comes the crowning blow to the Pharisees: “The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments.” What Jesus is saying is that these two commandments cannot be separated. Yes, to love God with all of your being is the first commandment. But there is no way we can separate the second commandment from the first: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. We cannot love God without also loving our neighbor.
