What our readings teach us today is that we must preach the good news with our words and with our lives. Words without actions are dead. Actions without faith behind them are empty.

The Gospel shows how strongly Jesus felt in regard to actions and words. He warns his disciples do what the scribes and Pharisees tell them but not to follow their example: "For they preach but they do not practice."

Jesus warns against doing things for show or for calling attention to one's self. These are empty actions; they have no meaning. In fact, they are antithetical to what Jesus asks of leaders and teachers of God's people. What Jesus wants is that "the greatest among you must be your servant."

As Christians and Catholics we have reason today to be careful that our lives speak the words Jesus gave us: preach the Gospel with your actions this week.
