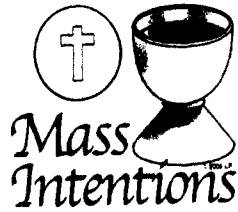

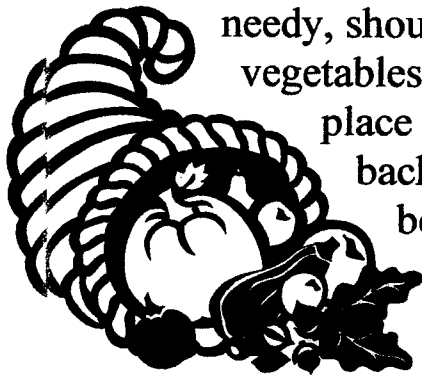

NOVEMBER: " A SCALABRINIAN MONTH"

The members of The Missionaries of St. Charles/Scalabrinians, who founded The Church of St. Joseph (together with St. Joseph Catholic School) and have been staffing it ever since, have always considered this month as "their own". On November 4th, they celebrated the Feast of St Charles, who was chosen as the spiritual protector of their community by their founder Blessed Scalabrini. The Congregation was founded on November 28th, 1887. This month the Scalabrinians are 118 years "young" working in 24 countries. In 1997, Pope John Paul II gave Scalabrinians another reason to hold November as Sacred. Bishop Scalabrini was beatified (declared "Blessed") on November 9th.

During this month let us pray that this international religious Congregation will be blessed with vocations... young men who will follow in the footsteps of Blessed Scalabrini and continue to work and serve migrant groups and the marginal in society. This year mark the 100th anniversary of the death of Blessed Scalabrini, which our parish will celebrate on November 20th.
