EPIPHANY

The significance of the feast of the Epiphany is that this is the beginning of God's revelation, not just to the chosen people, but to the whole world. The three magi, those mysterious wanderers from the East, represent us. So today we celebrate the epiphany of God in our lives, a celebration that is inspired by an earlier epiphany.

We see that the magi were used to reading the signs in the skies. This means they were searchers and visionaries. They were men of faith, a faith that they could not clearly define for themselves. Nevertheless they set out in blind faith in search of the Infant King. Like the magi we have to travel a long time in the dark, sometimes with only the faintest lights to illuminate the way. The magi encountered King Herod on their way. He wanted to destroy what the magi were intent of finding.

The spiritual search demands continuous sacrifice of personal comfort, determination to meet challenges and opposition. On this feast of the Epiphany, we partake of the Eucharist with a special sense of gratitude. We know that it will give us the strength to continue the journey.
