SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The only true teacher is God calling to each individual deep in the silence of his or her own heart. We welcome **Father Walter Tonelotto, c.s.**, as our new Pastor. Father Walter is also a member of the Congregation of the Missionaries of St. Charles – Scalabrinians. Before this assignment, Father Walter was the Rector of the Scalabrinian Philosophy Seminary in Port-au-Prince in Haiti. Prior to this assignment, Father Walter served as Pastor of Our Lady of Pompei Church in Montreal, Canada, which is one of the largest parishes in the Archdiocese of Montreal. Among his other assignments both in Canada and in the United States, Father Walter headed Radio Maria Program and served in the Provincial Council of the Scalabrinian Province of New York. Father Walter, a native of Venice, Italy, was ordained Priest on May 18, 1974.

We also express a heartfelt “Thank you” and “job well done” to **Father Lydio Tomasi, c.s.**, our Pastor for the past four years. Father Lydio has been instrumental in improving the physical plant of both the school and the Church making St. Joseph’s a beautiful house of worship once again. 2006 WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

The 2006 week of prayer for Christian Unity is January 18th to the 25th. “Where two or three are gathered in my name ...”(Matthew 18:20) is the theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Begun in 1908, these days have been set aside each year so that Christians the world over may share the prayer of Jesus: “that all may be one... that the world may believe” (John 17: 21).

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER AND PENANCE

“ In all the dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or 23, when the 22nd falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of penance and of prayer for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. The Mass “ For Peace and Justice” (no. 21 from “Masses for Various Needs”) should be celebrated with violet vestments as an appropriate liturgical observance for this day.” (US Conference of Catholic Bishops)
