FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

February 5, 2006

In line with the preparation to the Lenten Season, the Gospel of this Sunday gives us a good insight. In the middle of depression (like we see in the first reading) or in the middle of “doing good” (like we see in the healing of the mother-in-law of Peter in the Gospel) we need a break; we need some time for ourselves.

It is very interesting to realize that Jesus himself, while that “the whole town was gathered at the door”, felt the need to get away and find a “deserted place, where He prayed”. It is almost unbelievable that he had the need of prayer, since he was the Son of God. At the same time he was also a man he needed that time of intimacy with His Father.

This is something that we have to discover in our busy life, the capacity of making some time for ourselves. It is not only good for the blood pressure, but it gives us the possibility of INTERIORIZATION, something that is disappearing in our technological age. We are becoming an IMAGE SOCIETY. Television, Internet, advertising, Newspapers... everybody is going toward the instant message of an image. Even the news is short and immediate. We've lost the capability of thinking, reflecting, praying... Actually the whole education is becoming external, immediate and short. But how can we develop our inner self? How can we develop our feelings and emotions? How can we discover the true values of life? If we are not able to go to the inner self?

LENT IS HERE AGAIN!

Dear friends and parishioners,

In less than a month we will be entering one of the most sacred times of the whole year: the time of LENT. As Christians we are called to RENEW our life, in the many aspects of its existence. First on a personal level! Because we are grown ups, it does not mean that we don't have to keep growing; on the contrary, in our spiritual life if we don't "UPDATE" every year, we risk to fall out of line and become disconnected. On a family level we must re-establish the center of the life of each member on the WORD OF GOD. How many of us read the Bible in the family? A return to the Bible would be a great way to reunite our families. On a community level, we will organize a few activities which will be open and encouraged for the whole community. First, CATECHESIS: We will have the chance to read and reflect together on the first Encyclical Letter of our Pope, Benedict. Secondly, we will organize a "Community Penance Service" with private confessions and the traditional "Stations of the Cross". Finally an invitation to daily mass and weekly fasting! All this we will do together as a community of faith. We cannot also forget the idea of ALMSGIVING, which is an integral part of the process of conversion to which the Lord calls us.

All great religions of history have these periods of greater spiritual renewal; Islam has the Ramadan, Confucianism has the nirvana, Christianity has lent. It seems that human nature itself has a need of a cyclical spiritual renewal. We want to make this year's lent a meaningful one. A new blow of fresh air will pervade our community, our families and each one of us.
